Executive Summary

This deliverable presents the ONCOSCREEN Project website, which has been designed to be the central locus of the ONCOSCREEN digital identity. The deliverable explains the conceptual choices that were made in designing the project website. It also outlines the work that has been done in creating an impactful visual identity of ONCOSCREEN, which guided the website design.

The report includes a description of the landing page, which welcomes visitors to the project website. It also presents an overview of future developments and planned updates as the project advances to next stages. The current version of the landing page has been developed with the following goals in mind: i) to introduce ONCOSCREEN as a Horizon Europe Research and Innovation project to the general audience and relevant stakeholders interested in innovative technologies and methods for cancer screening, and ii) to establish the ONCOSCREEN visual identity, so the project becomes searchable, recognisable, and informative, motivating visitors to return to the website for information and updates.

The deliverable includes useful information about the sections, sub-pages and navigations of the website. Furthermore, it discusses the integrated principles of data privacy and data protection in the website design, while it summarizes the monitoring tools. Most importantly, it highlights the opportunities for visitors to get in touch with the ONCOSCREEN project team and to subscribe to the ONCOSCREEN social media channels.



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Introduction

Establishing digital identity of a brand is a key component of an effective communication and dissemination strategy. It starts with a dedicated website. The website becomes the main public medium through which external stakeholders and interested parties are introduced to the ONCOSCREEN project. It is of utmost importance to design the website having the user in mind.

Improved technologies optimising website performance has shifted the paradigm of web design to the user-centred approach. It values the user experience and guides the decision of what the website should look like. The best modern websites are simple and easy to navigate. They contain all relevant information in the homepage or within a single click of it. Another trend, which shows a steady growth in the EU, is the active use of the internet while on the move, using mobile and portable devices. These trends indicate that websites need to have an impactful visual identity, a coherent structure, streamlined navigation compatible with multiple devices (i.e., a responsive design), and well-presented content, which is accessible for diverse audiences.

The ONCOSCREEN typeface, logo, and colour palette have been developed within D7.2 Dissemination, Communication and Exploitation Plan and were initially presented at the project kick-off meeting. The colour palette is one of the most important visual elements of the ONCOSCREEN brand: it helps to creates a seamless scrolling experience between different sections of the website. In addition, the ONCOSCREEN LinkedIn and Twitter accounts were established to support the project website. All ONCOSCREEN channels have been consistently designed to correspond to the ONCOSCREEN brand, indicating that the visual brand identity of ONCOSCREEN has been developed and is being put in place.

The layout of the ONCOSCREEN website, its structure, and the information included were developed in cooperation with project partners as well as extensive feedback from the Project Coordinator. All partners provided the initial content for the website at launch. As project activities start to take place over the coming months, partners will be encouraged to contribute further to the development of the content though blogposts, research notes, and updates on the status of their work within the project. The website will continue to evolve over the project's lifetime with regular updates, cluster activities, uploads of publications, research materials and interactive content, such as social media feeds and explanatory videos and infographic.



1.1 Document outline

This deliverable describes the development of the ONCOSCREEN project website, which includes its core structure, layout, the initial content at the time of the website launch, and the plan for future updates. In this report, each section of the project website will be identified with its purpose, content to date, and future use. The report also underlines the importance of the ONCOSCREEN project website as the nucleus of an all-encompassing public platform for communication, dissemination, and exploitation activities envisioned within the project.

2 ONCOSCREEN Website Structure

2.1 Landing page




Figure 1 Welcome to ONCOSCREEN

The landing page welcomes visitors to the ONCOSCREEN website with a bright, interactive layout, please refer to *Figure 1*. A specially designed background has a creative and playful feature that corresponds to the name of the project and creates a strong impression on the first-time visitors of the website.

Drop-down menus have been integrated. In the future iterations of the website, they will allow easy navigation away from the landing page to find the information most relevant to visitors. Crucially, it will be possible to reach every page of the current website in just one click from the landing page as the website continues to be developed with simplicity and ease of access in mind.

The landing page in its presentation is structured to capture visitors' attention and provide them with all the information they need to continue browsing. The sections 'About', 'Partners' and 'Contact' have been identified as being of most immediate relevance to most visitors. Dynamic elements have been introduced positioning these pages at the front of the project website and they have taken priority in this website development stage.

2.2 About the project

When visitors first arrive to the website and scroll down the landing page, they will be presented with a brief, high-level description of the ONCOSCREEN project, as depicted in *Figure 2*. This section has been kept intentionally short, as it serves a simple purpose of answering some of the introductory questions that visitors may have about the project, including what ONCOSCREEN is, what it aims to achieve, and what innovative solutions it offers to the current challenges of colorectal cancer (CRC) screening and prevention in Europe.

2.3 Project partners

Following a brief description of the ONCOSCREEN project, a slideshow is featured that displays the logos of all 38 project partners. The ONCOSCREEN consortium brings together partners representing research partners, medical experts, and cancer researchers, oncology and cancer patient associations, policy makers, and representatives of industry and SMEs. Together, they enrich the ONCOSCREEN project with expertise and networks. The slideshow of logos, as presented in *Figure 3*, will enhance the trustworthiness of the project for first-time visitors to the website, as well as for those who have been directed to the website by one of the partners.




Figure 4 Example of the partner page

At the top of the landing page, the viewer has the opportunity to learn more about the partners and their respective organisations in-depth by clicking on the 'Partners' title. As seen in the example of CARRCOMMS in *Figure 4*, visitors to the website will be presented with an overview of the partner organisation, their specific role in the ONCOSCREEN project, and a link to their company website and social media channels.

2.4 Disclaimer and grant information

The bottom of the landing page includes the quality of information disclaimer (Article 17.3 of GA):

"Views and opinions expressed are of the author(s) only and do not necessarily reflect those of the European Union or the European Health and Digital Executive Agency. Neither the European Union nor the granting authority can be held responsible for them"

The landing page also explicitly acknowledges that the ONCOSCREEN project has received funding from the European Union's Horizon Europe research and innovation programme under grant agreement No. 101097036. It also includes the EU emblem with the funding statement, as specified in Article 17.2 of GA.

2.5 Privacy Policy

The ONCOSCREEN project is committed to implement a high standard of protection for personal data that has been set up in the European Union. The Privacy Policy has been integrated into the project website. It establishes that processing of personal data will be done responsibly, securely, and proportionally. The full text of the Privacy Policy is presented in the *Annex A* of this deliverable.

The project website also integrates the concept of "privacy by design", whereby visitors can make a choice on a lower or higher level of privacy. The cookie management tool allows visitors to grant their consent before any cookies are stored, and to specify their preferences for cookies which



are not strictly necessary for the functioning of the website. The full description of the Cookie Policy is also included in the **Annex A.**

2.6 Contact

The website also features a contact page, which simplifies communication between external stakeholders and interested parties and the ONCOSCREEN project. The website offers an option to send a message using the contact form provided on the website. For technical and project related enquiries, the contact information of the ONCOSCREEN Project Coordination Team, EXUS, is provided. The contact information of the Dissemination Manager, CARRCOMMS, is included in the contact page for media and communication enquiries.



3 Technologies used

3.1 Platform

The website is built on the free and open source PHP and MySQL-based Content Management System platform – WordPress. The range and quality of the available add-ons to the core system makes WordPress the ideal platform for a project site requiring the adaptability and flexibility of ONCOSCREEN. In addition to the WordPress core running on PHP and using a MySQL database, the site also employs the JQuery JavaScript library to provide some interactive and visual effects and motion. The site is built upon the Bootstrap responsive grid framework that facilitates the screen auto-adapting to provide the best experience irrespective of the device on which it is viewed. This ensures compatibility with each type of screen size and orientation from mobile phones to tablets.

3.2 Monitoring traffic to the website

Matomo is leading open-source analytics, which is respectful of user data, ownership, and privacy. This web analytics tool helps us to understand and analyse the overall performance and trends of the ONCOSCREEN website. It is used to measure website traffic patterns, e.g. total number of visitors, pageviews, duration of visits, downloads, and the geographical spread of visitors. This information is used to gain insights into performance and provide feedback how we can improve and optimise the website structure, so that the content and the design of the project website. The website will undergo annual review, based on the analytics and feedback from the partners to improve the website performance. If a particular section proves to be frequently visited, we can make it more prominent on the website and ensure that the navigation journey becomes easier for visitors.



4 Future development

The website will evolve and mature throughout the lifetime of the project. The new pages and information will be added to the website, as the project starts new tasks and identifies dissemination and networking opportunities. In the forthcoming months, the project website will include more information about the cluster "Prevention, including Screening", which will include an overview of the participation projects, common objectives within the EU Mission Cancer, and a plan of joint dissemination activities. Such information will potentially be hosted under a suppage of the ONCOSCREEN website to highlight such an important effort.

As the project moves toward the active development phase, the objective of the website is to act as a repository of all currently available information on ONCOSCREEN clinical trials, active recruitment, and events. A dedicated page on the ONCOSCREEN living lab with the information and dates on the planned hackathons will be added in the next month.

The process of updating the ONCOSCREEN website will be ongoing, with news, updates and information posted as they become available. Input will also be sought from partners in providing up-to-date news on their activities and progress including publications and any other exploitation material.



Conclusions

The initial structure and content of the ONCOSCREEN project website has been created with a view to future brand development, encompassing the wider dissemination, communication, and exploitation plan.

The website in its current iteration is intentionally minimal. However, the overall appearance and content of the website will gradually develop and broaden as the activities of ONCOSCREEN progress over its 48-month lifecycle. Updates to the website will therefore be attractive and engaging to visitors who wish to keep abreast of ONCOSCREEN's ongoing work and accomplishments.

Bearing in mind the fundamental goal of creating the ONCOSCREEN website, which is to serve as the nucleus of communication, dissemination, and exploitation activities of the project, the website has been created so that it is visually appealing, easily navigable, and informative to all identified stakeholders. As such, the ONCOSCREEN website has already begun to demonstrate itself as an accurate representation of the ONCOSCREEN brand, as well as being a future repository of all information and outputs pertaining to the work of the project.

Carr Communications is the ONCOSCREEN partner responsible for the dissemination and communication efforts of the project.

What data we collect

Automatically collected usage data

When you access ONCOSCREEN website on your device, we may automatically collect certain usage data, which may include:

- Date and time of access
- Duration of visit
- Your operating system
- The device you have used for access
- Browser type (including version)
- Referrer (name of the website that you accessed immediately before)
- Volume of data sent
- IP address
- Unique device identifiers and other diagnostic data.

Data provided by you

By contacting us through the website contact form, you will provide us with (and we will collect) your contact details, such as:

- your name
- your email address, and
- the **message** you submitted.

We are **not going to collect** any metadata that you did not expressly provide us with.

Purpose of data collection

We process your personal data for the following purposes:

- to provide this page to you (usage data)
- to use your personal data for ensuring the security of the page
- to respond to your messages/queries
- to provide you with our newsletter when you subscribe to it.

Legal bases of processing

Legitimate interest

For the **data that we collect automatically**, we rely on Article 6 (1) point f of the GDPR (i.e. *legitimate interest*), as they are required for us to provide the service, to ensure technical operation and to investigate and remove any malfunctions of the website and to ensure the page's security. It is in our interest to ensure the use and technical operability of our website. This data is automatically processed when our website is accessed. Unless they are provided, you cannot use our service.



Consent

For the **personal data that you provide us with through the contact form**, we rely on your **consent** (Article 6(1)a of the GDPR), which you express by completing the contact form and sending it our way or by actively signing up for our newsletter.

How we protect your data

We have put technical and organisational security measures and procedures in place to protect your personal data from loss, misuse, alteration, or destruction. We have made efforts to collect the minimum information needed to respond to your messages/requests.

How long we keep your data

If the data is no longer required for the relevant purpose, we erase the data **within 24h**.

Do we share personal data with third parties?

We may engage with several or all of the following categories of recipients:

- Law enforcement or other government and regulatory agencies (e.g., tax authorities) or other third parties as required by, and in accordance with, applicable law or regulation

Do we transfer your personal data outside the EU?

What are your data protection rights?

As a data subject, you can exercise the rights outlined in this section of the privacy policy. We may need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and ensure your right to access the information or to exercise any of your other rights. This helps us ensure that personal data is not



disclosed to any person who has no right to receive it. No fee is required to make an initial request unless your request is clearly unfounded or excessive. Depending on the circumstances, we may be unable to comply with your request based on other lawful grounds.

Right to access (GDPR Art. 15)

You have the right to obtain confirmation as to whether processing of your personal data takes place in connection with the operation of this ONCOSCREEN website. If this is the case, you can request access to the data that we store about you. Granting the right to access only occurs where your identification is possible.

Right to rectification (Art. 16)

You have the right to obtain the rectification of inaccurate personal data concerning you. The exercise of this right is only possible where you can be identified and the inaccuracy of data is verified.

Restriction of processing (Art. 18)

You have the right to obtain the restriction of processing, where:

- the accuracy of your personal data is contested;

Core policy

A cookie is a small text file that is downloaded onto 'terminal equipment' (e.g., a computer or a smartphone) when you access a website.
